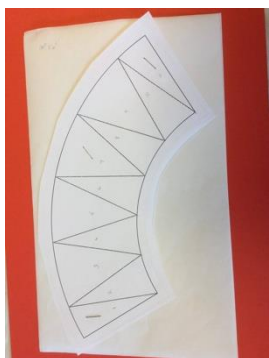


Freezer Paper Foundation Tutorial.

This is my preferred method for foundation Piecing, you can use the freezer paper multiple times and there's no paper to be removed at the end as the freezer paper just peels off.



Staple several pieces of freezer paper beneath the master template. Stitch along the solid seam lines without thread in your needle, trim back to solid outer line. (No seam allowance) You will add that later once the block is complete and you trim away the excess fabric.



This is what it should look like when ready for use



Iron the first piece of fabric onto the freezer paper, making sure to cover the shape completely, remember you will need to add the seam allowance later.



Fold back the freezer paper for section 2 so that only section 1 stuck to the freezer paper. Use an add a quarter ruler to trim back to the seam allowance

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Place fabric 2 right sides together and stitch alongside the paper, no sewing on the paper using this method.

Press the new shape over onto the freezer paper





Fold the next section of freezer paper back

Use the ruler to trim back to the seam allowance



Position the new fabric under the trimmed section and stitch along the seam line as before.

Repeat until all of the freezer paper is covered.



This is what the back will look like when it's finished, you can see that all the excess fabric has been trimmed back leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance around all 4 sides.

The paper can be peeled off and used several times.

This is the front ready to be stitched into the arcs to create a New York Beauty Block. You can use this method successfully for all patterns which require foundation piecing.
